

FOOTHILLS NURSING CONSORTIUM LPN-TO-ADN APPLICATION for ADMISSION Spring 2020

Thank you for your interest in the LPN-to-ADN Associate Degree Nursing (ADN) program at Foothills Nursing Consortium (FNC). Please read the entire packet thoroughly. We want to make sure you have the best possible chance of being selected by completing all processes and submitting all necessary application documents completely, correctly, and by the deadline. Please note, prospective nursing candidates residing in the four-county service area of Foothills Nursing Consortium should apply to the home college within the student's service area. You must be a high school graduate or have a General Education Diploma (GED) or High School Equivalency (HSE) diploma, as well as a current unrestricted LPN licensure listing on NC Board of Nursing (NCBON) without reprimands against license to be eligible to enter the nursing program.

Enrollment is limited, and admission is a competitive process. Meeting minimum admission criteria does not guarantee an applicant an offer of admission into the nursing program. FNC does not use a waiting list. Therefore, applicant records must be updated annually. If a student has applied previously, the student must reinitiate the process of applying including TEAS retesting, if applicable.

To enter the LPN-to-ADN program, students must have completed BIO 168, BIO 169, PSY 150 and ACA 115/ACA 122. All nursing courses must be completed in sequence.

Students are encouraged to take the required general education (non-nursing) courses prior to entry into the nursing program:

- BIO 175 General Microbiology or BIO 275 Microbiology (BIO 275 is transferrable)
- ENG 111 Writing & Inquiry
- ENG 112 Writing & Research in the Disciplines (or ENG 113 or ENG 114)
- PSY 241 Developmental Psychology
- Humanities Elective (3 credit hours)
 - Choose from this list: ART 111, ART 114, ART 115, HUM 115, MUS 110, MUS 112, PHI 215 and PHI 240.

In fall 2015, the North Carolina Community College System (NCCCS) mandated the Practical Nursing (PN) concept-based curriculum (CBC). The PN CBC was developed based on the NCCCS ADN CBC that originated in 2008. Therefore, LPNs who have completed a NCCCS PN CBC enter the LPN-to-ADN with a knowledge base regarding CBC. Thus, upon successful completion of NUR 214, the following will apply:

- LPNs who completed a NCCCS PN CBC will receive credit for NUR 111, NUR 112, and NUR 211.
- LPNs who completed a traditional medical model, or systems-based curriculum (prior to the NCCCS PN CBC) will receive credit for NUR 111 and NUR 112 and be required to take NUR 211 along with NUR 214 in first semester.

STEP 2: TAKE the ATI TEAS to Determine Ranking

The TEAS test will be given at the following campuses:

- Isothermal Community College – September 20, 2019
- Cleveland Community College – September 20, 2019
- McDowell Technical Community College - September 20, 2019

***Dates and Times subject to change based on availability.**

The estimated cost for the test is **\$70.00**. The pre-nursing coordinator will instruct you how to register and pay. The TEAS includes Reading, Math (including Algebra) Science, and English sections. Only the TEAS will be accepted. The TEAS composite (total adjusted) score will be used to rank applicants for the program and a **minimum score of 65** is required to be considered for the program. A composite score can only be attained through testing on all four areas at one sitting. Students will receive a score immediately upon completion of the TEAS. The higher the TEAS score, the higher the ranking.

Information on TEAS as well as exam preparation may be found at: [ATI Testing Website](#). Study guides are available for review in the college library or for purchase at vendor of your choice. Online practice assessments are also available at the vendor website.

Applicants should **not** schedule the TEAS until receiving notification from the pre-nursing advisor at the college of application.

The TEAS may be taken at an approved location within the United States following ATI guidelines. If taken at a test center other than a FNC college, the TEAS score submitted must be official from ATI, taken within the last five years, and must be received by the pre-nursing advisor by **September 20, 2019**.

The TEAS may be taken every 30 days and the higher score will be used for ranking. TEAS scores include one decimal place and are not rounded. TEAS scores are used to determine rankings. The highest scores will be ranked in first place. In the event of a tie, grade point average (GPA) will be used.

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Step 3: Attend MANDATORY FNC Group Information Session and complete requirements below:

Applicants are advised to begin working on the health form early. Minimally, a student should schedule an appointment with a health care provider within 1 week of acceptance letters and begin collection of immunization records. Students are advised to begin the process of health requirements (e.g. PPD, Hepatitis series, varicella titer or series) but evidence of these is not required until after program acceptance. Completed Health Forms and immunization information and a copy of your BLS HealthCare Provider (CPR) are to be returned to the FNC Director, Dr. Kim Amos, PO Box 804, Spindale, NC 28160 by **November 18, 2019**.

OTHER IMPORTANT INFORMATION

- ❖ Students admitted must attend the Mandatory FNC New Student Orientation prior to the first day of class. Students will be notified of orientation date.
- ❖ Admitted students are required to pay an Immunizations tracking fee (approximately **\$15.00 per year by credit card**) students will receive instructions for this along with their acceptance letters.
- ❖ A current unrestricted NCBON LPN Licensure, without reprimands against the license, is required **for entry** into the nursing program.
- ❖ Criminal background checks and drug screenings will be required by clinical sites for students admitted to the ADN program at the student's expense (**approximately \$ 65.00 cash only**) by a professional vendor at New Student Orientation. Failure to achieve acceptable standards will result in the denial of clinical privileges and the inability to continue in the nursing program.
- ❖ Students admitted will be assessed a **one-time testing fee of \$475.00** plus tax, which covers ATI Testing services, a prescriptive learning program to help prepare for the National Council Licensure Examination (NCLEX-RN). This will be included in the first semester tuition and fees.
- ❖ Personal health insurance is the responsibility of the student. Neither the college of application nor clinical agencies provide health coverage for the student. Any illness or injury incurred during class, lab or clinical during the program will be the financial responsibility of the student.
- ❖ All students must provide proof of cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) certification (American Heart Association Certification Basic Life Support is preferred) which should be good for two years by the program orientation day.
- ❖ Classes will be held at each campus and clinical rotations will vary among surrounding counties--- travel is required and may be more than one hour from campus. Class/clinical may be conducted during day, evening, and/or weekend hours. Students are responsible for arranging their transportation.
